With respect to the nursing professions, BCIT graduates approximately 20% of the province's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) students and 100% of students who graduate out of Specialty Nursing.

An opportunity now exists in the role of Associate Dean, Nursing to lead the ongoing development and program delivery of the BSN program. Reporting to the Dean, School of Health Sciences, this individual will work collaboratively with the Associate Dean of Specialty Nursing and other School of Health Science Associate Deans.

The ideal candidate is a visionary nursing executive who brings an exemplary record of leadership within the academic or health sectors where they have gained experience with strategic planning, implementation, and change management as well as undergraduate nursing education where they have supported best practices in curriculum integrity and educational practices.
