OPEN RANK POSITION (ASSISTANT, ASSOCIATE OR FULL PROFESSOR)

The Daphne Cockwell School of Nursing (DCSN) (http://www.ryerson.ca/nursing) invites applications for a tenure-stream faculty position at a rank commensurate with experience. This appointment is effective July 1, 2018, subject to final budgetary approval.

The Opportunity

Qualified applicants must have a completed PhD in nursing or a related field (e.g., Indigenous Studies, Sociology, Social Science and Health, Anthropology, Internationalization of Education, Biostatistics, Epidemiology, Health Policy, Gender Studies, Ethics, Community Health/Public Health).

Qualified applicants will have a well-established program of research with a strong track record of research funding, publications and leading multidisciplinary research teams, demonstrated teaching excellence, supervision of graduate students and a capacity to teach courses across both baccalaureate and master's programs that will contribute to the ongoing success of the DCSN.

Qualified applicants' program of research will contribute to the development of knowledge related to one or a combination of the domains of professional practice and outcomes across the healthcare continuum – Indigenous/Aboriginal health, Health Services research, health equity, nursing education, interprofessional education and collaboration, leadership in health policy, biostatistics, and clinical epidemiology. Qualified applicants will also display a capacity to meet high expectations for teaching, scholarship, grantsmanship, academic leadership, collaboration and collegial service.

The fully accredited DCSN offers three dynamic programs: the Collaborative Nursing Degree Program, offered in partnership with Centennial and George Brown Colleges; the Post Diploma Nursing Degree Program; and a Master of Nursing Program that includes the Ontario Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner Program. The DCSN has a diverse student body of approximately 2800 full time and part time individuals in outreach and continuing education partnership programs. There are approximately 250 full time and part time graduate students enrolled in course stream, thesis, or nurse practitioner studies. Faculty and student participation is valued and encouraged within and between nursing programs. As well, the DCSN is one of nine Schools situated within the Faculty of Community Services. Faculty and students across the various schools work closely with each other. The DCSN takes pride in their innovative and responsive approach to educating students.

All applicants will receive an email confirming receipt of application, but only those candidates selected for the short-list of consideration will be contacted for interviews. Submissions from all qualified applicants are encouraged and priority will be given to a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada. Please indicate in your application if you are a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada.

The application deadline is Thursday November 30, 2017.
