

The University of Victoria School of Nursing invites applications from qualified individuals for **one full time Assistant Teaching Professor**. The position will begin May 1, 2018 or as negotiated. We are seeking a faculty member with a commitment to the scholarship of teaching and leadership in undergraduate and graduate nursing programs. Our School is committed to mentoring new and experienced faculty in the development of their academic careers.

The University of Victoria School of Nursing is a leader in undergraduate and graduate nursing education and research in partnership with different educational, community and practice organizations. The School offers the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree (BSN) to prepare nurses to work with individuals, families, and communities, guided by health promotion principles. The BSN program is delivered through a collaborative partnership with colleges in British Columbia and the Northwest Territories. The School of Nursing also offers two graduate degrees: a PhD in Nursing and the Master of Nursing Degree (Advanced Practice / Nurse Practitioner / Double Degree in Nursing and Health Informatics). All of our graduate programs are offered through distance learning and distributed learning technologies.

The School is situated in theFaculty of Human and Social Development, a multi-professional faculty with a commitment to the student experience of dynamic learning in extraordinarily rich practice and community setting for vital impact on health and social development. Faculty participate with colleagues, students, and the public in socially engaging ways and strive to integrate teaching, scholarship, and research at all program levels.

The University of Victoria has a well-developed Centre for Learning and Teaching to support successful teaching practices. Our School of Nursing faculty provide mentoring and support for those establishing themselves as teacher-scholars. Faculty seek areas of collaborative advantage through team work within the School and beyond.

Candidates for appointment for the Assistant Teaching Professor must have the following:

- active registration and in good standing with the College of Registered Nurses of British Columbia (CRNBC) or be eligible for registration and commit to achieving registration if not currently registered;
- a baccalaureate degree in Nursing, with at least one graduate degree in Nursing preferred doctoral degree (PhD or equivalent) in Nursing or other health related field;
- demonstrated experience and excellence in leadership for the advancement of undergraduate and graduate programs and curricula; practice model innovation and simulation, nursing practice and patient orientated research, health systems research and informatics, supporting teaching excellence, Indigenous nursing and health, and interprofessional education;
- demonstrated excellence and substantial experience in teaching and scholarship, within a post-secondary setting;
- demonstrated ability to teach in the practice and classroom settings, and a willingness to teach in online technology-enhanced and experiential learning environments;

(Note: all undergraduate on campus courses are taught in the classroom while incorporating online distributed learning experiences; all graduate courses are taught through online distributed learning.)

As a member of the School of Nursing, you will work with colleagues to advance a shared mission of sustainable quality professional programs, decolonization of the academic environment, anti-racist pedagogy, and community-engaged scholarship.
