

# Memorial University of Newfoundland School of Nursing Tenure Track Positions

Memorial University School of Nursing invites applications for **three** tenure track positions at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, effective August 1, 2019 [negotiable]. These positions are subject to final budgetary approval.

Memorial University is the largest university in Atlantic Canada. As the province's only university, Memorial plays an integral role in the education and cultural life of Newfoundland and Labrador. Offering diverse undergraduate and graduate programs to almost 19,000 students, Memorial provides a distinctive and stimulating environment for learning. St. John's is a friendly city with great historic charm, a vibrant cultural life, and easy access to a wide range of outdoor activities.

The School of Nursing is located on the university campus and offers programs leading to the Bachelor of Nursing (4 year option and accelerated option), the Master of Nursing (practicum and nurse practitioner options), the Post Master's Nurse Practitioner Graduate Diploma, and the PhD in Nursing. The undergraduate program has been recently revised and a concept based curriculum has been implemented.

A completed earned doctorate is required for appointment to any tenure track position. If the successful candidates have not completed an earned doctorate, they may be appointed to a regular term, non-renewable three year appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor. If candidates complete all of the requirements for the doctorate during the first 24 months of the term appointment they shall begin a tenure-track appointment following completion of the requirements of the degree.

One position is available in each of the three following areas:

#### **Nurse Practitioner**

This position is for a faculty member who is a Nurse Practitioner who can teach in our Nurse Practitioner Program. Position responsibilities include teaching and supervision in the undergraduate and graduate programs, conducting a program of research and academic service. The successful candidate must be eligible for licensure with the Association of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador as a Nurse Practitioner and hold a master's degree and an earned doctoral degree. The master's or doctoral degree must be in nursing. Doctoral candidates who are close to finishing the degree may also be considered.

The successful candidate must demonstrate evidence of a beginning program of scholarship, including research, publications, and external funding. Candidates must also be prepared to teach in the undergraduate, graduate, and Nurse Practitioner programs and thus must have relevant clinical experience as a nurse practitioner. **This position is for a Nurse Practitioner** and we are particularly interested in applications from Nurse Practitioners who can teach statistics and/or quantitative research methods courses in our graduate programs.

## <u>Acute Care Maternal-Child Nursing</u> Reference Number: NURS-2018-002

This position is for a faculty member who is a Registered Nurse and can teach acute care maternal-child nursing. Position responsibilities include teaching and supervision in the undergraduate and graduate programs, conducting a program of research, and academic service. The successful candidate must be eligible for registration with the Association of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador as a Registered Nurse and hold a master's degree and an earned doctoral degree. The master's degree or

doctoral degree must be in nursing. Doctoral candidates who are close to finishing the degree may also be considered.

The successful candidate must demonstrate evidence of a beginning program of scholarship, including research, publications, and external research funding. Candidates must also be prepared to teach in the undergraduate and graduate programs and thus must have relevant clinical experience as a Registered Nurse. This position is for a Registered Nurse who can teach acute care maternal-child nursing and we are particularly interested in applicants who can teach statistics and/or quantitative research methods courses in our graduate programs.

## **Acute Care Child Nursing**

This position is for a faculty member who is a Registered Nurse and can teach acute care child nursing. Position responsibilities include teaching and supervision in the undergraduate and graduate programs, conducting a program of research, and academic service. The successful candidate must be eligible for registration with the Association of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador as a Registered Nurse and hold a master's degree and an earned doctoral degree. The master's degree or doctoral degree must be in nursing. Doctoral candidates who are close to finishing the degree may also be considered.

The successful candidate must demonstrate evidence of a beginning program of scholarship, including research, publications, and external research funding. Candidates must also be prepared to teach in the undergraduate and graduate programs and thus must have relevant clinical experience as a Registered Nurse. **This position is for a Registered Nurse who can teach acute care child nursing** and we are particularly interested in applicants who can teach statistics and/or quantitative research methods in our graduate program.
