

## **TRENT/FLEMING SCHOOL OF NURSING**

Appointees will teach courses over the fall, winter and summer terms. We are interested in individuals who have expertise in one or more of the following areas: nursing leadership, health policy acute and chronic care.

The mission of the Trent/Fleming School of Nursing is to provide programs that meet the highest standard for nursing education and foster graduates who have developed superior humanistic and scientific caring, professional and social responsibility and critical inquiry.

A Master's degree is required; a Ph.D. completed or in progress, is preferred. Preference will be given to candidates with a graduate degree in nursing. Candidates will be registered or eligible for registration without restrictions by the College of Nurses of Ontario. Prior experience as an educator in a university based nursing program is preferred.

Some experience in curriculum development and planning are required. The successful applicant will be able to function effectively within a team teaching model as well as in an individual capacity.
