

Trent/Fleming School of Nursing

Trent University invites applications for two tenure track appointments in the Trent/Fleming School of Nursing at the rank of Assistant Professor, commencing July 1, 2019, subject to budgetary approval. We are interested in individuals who have expertise in one or more of the School's areas of focus: indigenous communities, mental health, rural health, aging, women's health and gender. For one position, preference will be given to candidates whose research interests are in the area of indigenous health and communities.

The mission of the Trent/Fleming School of Nursing is to provide programs that meet the highest standard for nursing education and foster graduates who have developed superior humanistic and scientific caring, professional and social responsibility and critical inquiry.

A PhD is required, and preference will be given to candidates with a completed graduate degree in nursing. Candidates will be registered or eligible for registration without restrictions by the College of Nurses of Ontario. Prior experience as an educator in a university based nursing program is preferred.

Trent University is situated north east of Toronto on 1,450-acres straddling the Otonabee River in Peterborough, Ontario, Canada, a vibrant mid-sized city just 90 minutes from Toronto.
