

The School of Nursing invites applications from talented nursing researchers and scholars for a **full-time tenure track** faculty position at the rank of **Assistant or Associate Professor** to commence **July 1, 2020** or as negotiated. We welcome applications from nurses with teaching and research experience relevant to advancing the profession and the discipline of nursing with a preferred focus on nursing education research and leadership. The School has programs of research in the philosophy, theory and ethics of nursing education, and design of experiential learning approaches with a particular interest in decolonization and integration of Indigenous perspectives on nursing and health. As a member of the School of Nursing, the successful candidate will work with colleagues to advance a shared mission of sustainable quality professional programs, community engaged research and scholarship and a commitment to critical and anti-racist perspectives on theory and practice.

The School of Nursing is dedicated to excellence in accessible and innovative undergraduate and graduate nursing education, research initiatives, and professional practice and service to the community in British Columbia, in Canada, and beyond. The School offers the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree (BSN) to prepare nurses to work with individuals, families, and communities, guided by health promotion principles. The BSN program is delivered through a collaborative partnership with colleges in British Columbia and the Northwest Territories. The School of Nursing also offers two graduate degrees: a PhD in Nursing and the Master of Nursing Degree (Advanced Practice / Nurse Practitioner / Double Degree in Nursing and Health Informatics). All of our graduate programs are offered through distance learning and distributed learning technologies.

    - research experience relevant to advancing the profession and the discipline of Nursing and aimed at developing the body of knowledge required to support philosophical, theoretical, and workplace integrated learning and leadership role development;
    - experience supervising graduate students is an asset
  - For consideration at the Associate Professor rank, qualified individuals must also possess the following:
    - evidence of effective teaching; and
    - record of substantial scholarly, professional or creative achievement within the discipline of Nursing;
    - experience supervising graduate students is an asset
- active registration and in good standing with the <u>British Columbia College of Nursing Professionals</u> (BCCNP) or be eligible for registration and commit to achieving registration if not currently registered.
