

2-Year Limited Term (Assistant Professor & Clinical Coordinator)

The School of Nursing in Dalhousie's Faculty of Health invites applications from qualified candidates for a full-time, 2-Year Limited Term faculty position at the rank of Lecturer.

Dalhousie University is comprised of 6,000 faculty and staff amongst its 13 faculties. Current enrollment is 18,500 graduate and undergraduate students. As part of Canada's U15 research-intensive university group, Dalhousie is an influential driver of the region's intellectual, social and economic development. It is the largest university in Atlantic Canada and is located on the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq in the heart of Halifax (Kjipuktuk), a scenic coastal city and capital of Nova Scotia which is home to 13 Mi'kmaq First Nations, a deeply rooted African Nova Scotia community, an increasingly diverse population which also includes a vibrant workforce of people living with (dis)Abilities.

The Faculty of Health's faculty, staff and students are committed to improving the wellbeing of individuals, families, communities and populations through diverse health programming, collaborative research and strong community partnerships. The Faculty of Health is one of the largest faculties at Dalhousie, comprised of eight schools, one college and one program, more than 200 faculty members, 80 staff members, and over 3,000 students. With the most programmatically diverse health faculty in Canada, our students are exposed to a broad range of health topics and learning experiences.

The School of Nursing's vision is a commitment to strive in partnering to meet the health needs of Nova Scotia; uphold and validate the values of integrity, equity, inclusion and well-being: "healthy people and health communities". We manifest and advance curricula, scholarship and school culture that are congruent with those values.

The successful candidate will be required to teach undergraduate and/or graduate students. The teaching assignments will include teaching in *(adult medicine-surgical nursing/maternal-child /primary health care-public health-population health/mental health and addictions)*, interprofessional education, distance and context-based learning, and/or clinical simulation learning as well as courses to reflect the expertise of the successful candidate within the needs of the School. The successful candidate, in their combined role of teaching and Clinical Coordinator, will also be expected to be responsible for effective communications including establishing and maintaining strong

relationships with affiliate placement coordinators in each of the agencies/practices in which students are placed for clinical learning experience and meeting with agency staff regarding placement concerns and clarifying the placement process. The successful candidate will: establish a repository of knowledge with respect to clinical education in undergraduate/graduate programs in nursing including quality evidence supporting strategies to develop practice environments as exemplary learning environments, preceptors and clinical teachers. The successful candidate will make evidence-informed recommendations to the Director, Graduate and Undergraduate and Graduate Studies Committee(s); provide strategic direction for long term planning in clinical based education in nursing and intra – and inter-professional health professional education. The successful candidate is expected to be knowledgeable about the Nurse Practitioner role and the practice settings in which Nurses and Nurse Practitioners practice in Nova Scotia.

Applicants must hold a minimum of a Baccalaureate degree in Nursing; a Master's degree in Nursing and/or a health-related discipline, have demonstrated commitment to developing excellence in their teaching and practice, and have strong administrative experience. Three-five years' experience in nursing education and nursing experience in one or more of the following specialities: *(adult medicine-surgical nursing/maternal-child /primary health care-public health-population health/mental health and addictions.* Applicants must be eligible for registration with the Nova Scotia College of Nursing. The candidate is expected to become an active and engaged member of the School, Faculty and University. Activities at local, national and international levels are expected to promote continuous improvement in teaching and learning at Dalhousie. There is no expectation of a research workload associated with this position.

Applicants must include a cover letter stating qualifications and experience, Curriculum Vitae, including a statement of teaching experience and interests, and copies of teaching evaluations, if available.
