The School of Nursing in Dalhousie's Faculty of Health invites applications from qualified candidates for a full-time, continuing faculty position at the Instructor rank. Exceptional cases at the Senior Instructor rank may be considered.

Dalhousie University is comprised of 6,000 faculty and staff amongst its 13 faculties. Current enrollment is 18,500 graduate and undergraduate students. As part of Canada's U15 research-intensive university group, Dalhousie is an influential driver of the region's intellectual, social and economic development. It is the largest university in Atlantic Canada and is located on the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq in the heart of Halifax (Kjipuktuk), a scenic coastal city and capital of Nova Scotia which is home to 13 Mi'kmaq First Nations, a deeply rooted African Nova Scotia community, an increasingly diverse population which also includes a vibrant workforce of people living with (dis)Abilities.

The Faculty of Health's faculty, staff and students are committed to improving the well-being of individuals, families, communities and populations through diverse health programming, collaborative research and strong community partnerships. The Faculty of Health is one of the largest faculties at Dalhousie, comprised of eight schools, one college and one program, more than 200 faculty members, 80 staff members, and over 3,000 students. With the most programmatically diverse health faculty in Canada, our students are exposed to a broad range of health topics and learning experiences.

The School of Nursing's vision is a commitment to strive in partnering to meet the health needs of Nova Scotia; uphold and validate the values of integrity, equity, inclusion and well-being: "healthy people and health communities". We manifest and advance curricula, scholarship and school culture that are congruent with those values.

The successful candidate will be required to teach undergraduate and/or graduate students as well as mentor graduate students. The teaching assignments will include teaching in (adult medicine and/or surgical nursing / pediatrics), interprofessional education, distance and context-based learning, and/or clinical simulation learning as well as courses to reflect the expertise of the successful candidate within the needs of the School.

Applicants must hold a minimum of a Baccalaureate degree in Nursing; a Master's degree in Nursing and/or health-related discipline; Doctorate prepared an asset, in a health-related discipline and have demonstrated a commitment to developing excellence in their teaching and practice. Three-five years' experience in nursing education and nursing experience in one or more of the following specialities: adult medicine and/or surgical nursing / pediatrics is preferred. If Master's or Doctorate prepared in Nursing, applicants must be eligible for registration with the Nova Scotia College of Nursing. The candidate is expected to become an active and engaged member of the School, Faculty and University. Activities at local, national and international levels are expected to promote continuous improvement in teaching and learning at Dalhousie. There is no expectation of a research workload associated with this position. A licence to practice as a Nurse Practitioner would be considered an asset.

Applicants must include a cover letter stating qualifications and experience, Curriculum Vitae, including a statement of teaching experience and interests, and copies of teaching evaluations, if available.
