Candidates must (1) be registered as a Registered Nurse (Extended Class) in good standing or eligible for registration (Extended Class) with the College of Nurses of Ontario; hold current registration and qualifications as a Nurse Practitioner in Ontario (2) have a baccalaureate degree in Nursing; (3) have a Master's degree in Nursing or a related field (Nursing preferred), and (4) have a PhD or PhD near completion at the time of the appointment in Nursing or other relevant area (Nursing preferred).

The successful candidate will be expected to engage in outstanding, innovative, and, as appropriate, externally funded research at the highest level. Candidates must provide evidence of research excellence or promise of research excellence of a recognized international calibre as demonstrated in: the research statement; a record of publications (or forthcoming publications) with significant journals in the field; presentations at major conferences; awards and accolades; and strong recommendations from referees of high standing.

The position will involve graduate teaching and supervision, as well as undergraduate teaching and the successful candidate must be suitable for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

Evidence of excellence or promise of excellence in teaching will be provided through: the teaching statement; teaching accomplishments and pedagogical innovations including in high priority areas such as experiential education and technology enhanced learning; teaching evaluations; and strong letters of reference.
