

Memorial University of Newfoundland and Labrador Faculty of Nursing Tenure Track Positions

Memorial University Faculty of Nursing invites applications for **two** tenure-track positions at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, effective August 1, 2022 [negotiable]. These positions are subject to final budgetary approval. Position responsibilities include teaching and supervision in the undergraduate program and may include teaching in the graduate program depending on the applicant's background and the needs of the Faculty of Nursing. Position responsibilities also include conducting a program of research and academic service.

Memorial University is the largest university in Atlantic Canada. As the province's only university, Memorial plays an integral role in the education and cultural life of Newfoundland and Labrador. Offering diverse undergraduate and graduate programs to almost 18,000 students, Memorial provides a distinctive and stimulating environment for learning in St. John's, a safe and friendly city with great historic charm, a vibrant cultural life, and easy access to a wide range of outdoor activities.

The Faculty of Nursing is located on the university campus and offers programs leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (four-year and accelerated options), a Master of Science in Nursing (practicum and nurse practitioner options), a Post Master's Nurse Practitioner Graduate Diploma, and a PhD in Nursing. The undergraduate program has recently been revised and a concept-based curriculum has been implemented.

A completed earned PhD degree is required to receive the rank of Assistant Professor and to be in a tenure-track position. Applicants who are close to finishing a PhD degree will be considered. If a successful candidate has not completed a PhD degree they may be appointed to a regular term, non-renewable, three-year appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor. If the candidate completes all of the requirements for the PhD degree during the first 24 months of the term appointment they shall begin a tenure-track appointment following completion of the requirements of the degree.

Applicants are invited to apply if they have either: 1) completed or are completing a dissertation using quantitative research methodology and are able to teach statistics and/or quantitative research methods in our graduate program and/or 2) have experience in mental health nursing and are able to teach classroom and clinical courses in this area.

The successful candidate must demonstrate evidence of a beginning program of scholarship, including research, publications, and the ability to obtain external research funding. Candidates must also be prepared to teach in the undergraduate program, and may be assigned to teach in the graduate programs depending on their background and the needs of the Faculty of Nursing and thus, must have relevant clinical experience. A minimum of two years of clinical experience in an area of nursing as a Registered Nurse is required to teach in this area in the undergraduate program. If the successful applicant is a Nurse Practitioner, they require a minimum of three years of experience as a Nurse Practitioner, and preferably five years, to teach in the nurse practitioner program.

All successful applicants must hold a current practicing license with the College of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador (CRNNL) as a Registered Nurse or Nurse Practitioner; provide a criminal records screening and vulnerable sector check; and an up-to-date immunization record.
