

## TEACHING TERM APPOINTMENTS FACULTY OF NURSING MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY OF NEWFOUNDLAND

## (12-Month Teaching Term Appointments)

Memorial University Faculty of Nursing is located on the university campus and offers programs leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (four-year and accelerated options), a Master of Science in Nursing (practicum and nurse practitioner options), a Post Master's Nurse Practitioner Graduate Diploma, and a PhD in Nursing. The undergraduate program has been recently revised and a concept-based curriculum has been implemented.

The Faculty of Nursing has 12-month teaching term appointments for the 2021-22 academic year for clinical teaching in all clinical areas, including the Nurse Practitioner Program. While these appointments are for clinical teaching, occasionally the incumbent may be asked to teach in a classroom or lab setting for a 4-8 month contract.

The minimum qualifications for teaching-term appointments at the undergraduate level are a completed bachelor's degree in nursing and a master's degree, with preference given to applicants with a Master of Nursing or Master of Science in Nursing degree. Candidates who are near completion of a master's degree will also be considered. A minimum of two years of nursing experience within the past three years in the clinical area of practice is required for clinical teaching in the undergraduate program. The minimum qualification for teaching a clinical course in the nurse practitioner program is three to five years of experience as a nurse practitioner.

Please note that all successful applicants must hold a current practicing license with the College of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador (CRNNL) for the duration of the contract period, provide a criminal records screening and vulnerable sector check and an up-to-date immunization record.

All positions are subject to budgetary approval and sufficient enrolment.

A complete application is comprised of: (a) a letter of introduction outlining relevant clinical and teaching experience; (b) evidence of effective teaching; (c) curriculum vitae; and (d) names and contact information for three references under separate cover to the Dean, Faculty of Nursing.
