


CHARTING A SUCCESSFUL PATH: TIPS FOR DOCTORAL STUDIES

What to Expect

- Excitement & anxiety
- Feeling like you're starting over
- Imposter
- Unsure what to expect
- Relearning a new 'career' once you've already mastered one
- Pressure to meet an expectation you're not always sure how to define
- Ability to multi-task
- Feeling like everyone else knows what they're doing

Philosophical Approach & Opportunities

- Reflect on your own values
- $\,\circ\,$ Accept there will be ebb and flow
- It's a privilege –remind yourself, often
- Embrace all of the learning opportunities you can
- It's not possible to do them all, but be strategic

 - University and beyond
 - *Keep track of them on your CV
 - *Tailor to your areas of interest & your research focus




Shape Your Program

- Hang out with people who are positive, supportive and cheer you on
- Choose electives that fit within your potential research area
- Choose course assignments that help you build your research interest portfolio
- Ask your profs to alter assignments so they can be publications
- Manage your references
- Write papers on your research area of interest and methodology
- Publish your papers, with your professors and peers, if that makes sense

Practice-Research Program

Children & Families

Guided by a passion to practice with a certain population



Research area- be comfortable with being uncomfortable

- It takes time
- Choose something you're passionate about & a supervisor who can be a mentor
- Align with others in the field (mentors) who you can learn from
- Expose yourself to varied content in the area
- Think creatively, be innovative
- Research skills are a tool
- PhD is to advance knowledge and practice
- Nurses are AWESOME!
- Consider things that have been nagging at you, don't make sense
- Find ways to approach in an original way

Funding

- Apply!! As often as you can. \$ begets \$
- Start early- it **ALWAYS** takes longer than you expect!!
- Review successful ones, have reviewed, don't be defensive
- Be resourceful-there are a LOT of opportunities
 - University, Hospital, Organizations, Lung Assoc, Canadian Cancer, CIHR, CNA
- It's tedious and feels like a LOT of work-but it's so worth it!
- Once you have a template -it's easier-recycle-but pay close attention to *guidelines*
- Build positive relationships with faculty and mentors so they'll be enthusiastic about writing you letters of support.
- Give them LOTS of time and resources to prepare their letters
- $\circ\,$ Submit applications $\ensuremath{\text{before}}$ the day it is due


Enjoy!!!
