



Canadian Examination for Baccalaureate Nursing (CEBN) Stakeholder Advisory Committee

Terms of Reference:

Mandate

The Canadian Examination for Baccalaureate Nursing (CEBN) Stakeholder Advisory Committee reviews the draft exam blueprint and makes recommendation to the CEBN Examination Committee in relation to the patient safety competencies for health professionals developed by the Canadian Patient Safety Institute (CPSI), the infection prevention competencies developed by the Infection Prevention and Control Canada (IPAC), and the interprofessional collaboration competencies developed by the accreditation bodies for health professional education programs in Canada.

Accountability

The Stakeholder Advisory Committee reports to the CEBN Examination Committee.

Roles and Responsibilities

1. Review the draft exam blueprint.
2. Review the specific learning outcomes in the exam blueprint that address their areas of expertise (patient safety, infection prevention, IPE).
3. Propose recommended revisions to the blueprint based on their review.

Term of Office and Membership

Members will serve terms of one year and may be appointed for additional terms.

It is desirable for the members of the committee to be knowledgeable in examination blueprint development gained through academic preparation and/or hands-on experience.

Members of the Stakeholder Advisory Committee have expertise in the competencies for patient safety, infection prevention and control, and interprofessional collaboration, and include the following representation:

- two representatives selected by CPSI;
 - two representatives selected by IPAC;
 - two representatives selected by the network of IPE centres in Canada; and,
 - The CASN Executive Director (ex-officio member).
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- The committee typically has three teleconference meetings annually.
 - CASN staff provides administrative support to the committee.



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- Members must sign a non-disclosure agreement and ensure that the security and confidentiality of all working documents are strictly maintained.
