National Awards & Recognition

Administrators, faculty members and educators from CASN member schools are eligible to be nominated to be on the <u>board of directors</u>, CASN Accreditation Bureau (CAB), committees such as the Awards & Nomination Committee, along with other committees, task forces and advisory committees.

Individuals from CASN member schools are eligible to be nominated for CASN Awards such as the Academic Administrative Excellence Award, Ethel Johns Award, Nursing Education Excellence Award – tenured and non-tenured, Nursing Research Excellence Award, and the Wendy McBride Award for Accreditation Reviewer Excellence.









In addition, faculty from member schools may apply to the <u>Pat Griffin research fund</u> for annual research awards supporting nursing education research. They may also apply to become a <u>fellow</u> of the Canadian Nurse Educator Institute.

Take part at Council

Each member of the CASN Council has one voting representative at the CASN <u>Council meeting</u>, which takes place every fall. The voting council member (or their delegate/proxy) votes on motions at the Council meeting/Annual General meeting and votes in the elections on behalf of their school.

The Council meeting includes the Annual General meeting, Graduate Education Forum, and Undergraduate Education Forum. This is an opportunity to network

with other administrators and educators from across the country, share ideas and learn about best practices with respect to nursing education.
