You will work closely with the associate dean(s) and other department chairs to provide implementation support to the Faculty. You will actively collaborate with faculty and staff in the planning, implementation and evaluation of academic programs and day-to-day department operations. You will also teach and engage in research (as applicable to your chosen focus).

The Department of Professional Nursing and Allied Health offers courses and experiences that meet current professional nursing needs. Programs offered include Perioperative Nursing for LPNS and RNs, Wound Care Management, Occupational Health, and Nursing Refresher. The Department also houses the Clinical Simulation Centre.

The Department of Nursing Practice offers courses focused on the implementation of knowledge to practice through innovative and critical clinical learning to support development of nurse leaders. Faculty members in the Department of Nursing Practice are experts in nursing care and understand clinical contexts in which nurses practice.

These positions **require eligibility for and obtainment of unencumbered licensure with the College of Registered Nurses of Alberta (CRNA)**. Position requirements include a graduate degree in nursing or a related field, doctoral preparation preferred. You will have expertise in an area of nursing practice and a successful record of, or additional education in, teaching in nursing. A developed, or developing, program of related research or scholarly activity is preferred, and an understanding of post credential professional education or nursing practice education, would be an asset. You are passionate about excellence in undergraduate nursing education and have notable curriculum development experience in nursing or health-related education. You are a collaborative team member, and a leader who demonstrates a strong commitment to service within your role. You are curious and able to collaborate with others to envision and implement an innovative approach to undergraduate nursing education.
