They represent the School on internal and external committees and help advance the School's mission through collaborative and community-engaged leadership. The Associate Dean will have a demonstrated commitment to Truth and Reconciliation and to fostering an inclusive and equitable academic environment. Experience engaging with Indigenous communities and promoting anti-racist and decolonizing practices will be considered a strong asset.

Candidates must hold a doctoral degree in Nursing or a closely related field, with at least one graduate degree in Nursing. A minimum of three years of progressive academic leadership in a postsecondary setting is required. The successful candidate will demonstrate a record of scholarly achievement, strong interpersonal and team-building skills, and the ability to lead in a collegial, student-centred environment. Eligibility for registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario (CNO) is required.

Applicants should include a statement confirming their eligibility to work in Canada.
