Associate Dean Graduate Programs

Memorial University of Newfoundland Faculty of Nursing invites applications for the position of Associate Dean (Graduate Programs) at the rank of Associate or Full Professor, effective August 1, 2025. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.

Memorial University is the largest university in Atlantic Canada. As the province's only university, Memorial plays an integral role in the education and cultural life of Newfoundland and Labrador. Offering diverse undergraduate and graduate programs to almost 19,000 students, Memorial provides a distinctive and stimulating environment for learning. St. John's is a friendly city with great historic charm, a vibrant cultural life, and easy access to a wide range of outdoor activities.

The Faculty of Nursing is located on the university campus and offers programs leading to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (4-year option and accelerated option), the Master of Science in Nursing (practicum and Nurse Practitioner option), the Post-Master's Nurse Practitioner Graduate Diploma, and the PhD in Nursing.

Associate Dean (Graduate Programs)

Reporting to the Dean, the Associate Dean (Graduate Programs) provides leadership in planning, implementation and evaluation of the graduate programs in the Faculty of Nursing, thereby promoting and supporting academic success. This is a stipendiary position.

The ideal candidate should possess the following qualifications:

- A master's degree and an earned doctoral degree (one graduate degree must be in nursing).
- Strong leadership and administrative skills.
- Experience in graduate nursing education and in the supervision of graduate students.
- Eligibility for registration with the College of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador (CRNNL) as a registered nurse or nurse practitioner.
- A developed program of research and record of scholarly activity consistent with the rank of an Associate or Full Professor.

A complete application is comprised of: (a) letter of introduction outlining relevant research and experience in teaching and graduate supervision; (b) curriculum vitae; and (c) names and contact information of three referees.
